The PCI (Payment Card Industry) Program was created by leading credit card companies, including MasterCard and Visa, to ensure solid security practices are followed by financial institutions, Internet vendors and retail merchants.

PCI Compliance At-a-Glance

In 2006, the Payment Card Industry Security Standards Council (PCI SSC) was formed by American Express, Discover, JCB, MasterCard and Visa. By establishing an independent body designed to govern payment industry security standards, the PCI SSC has created a unified global system that is more efficient for stakeholders and consumers.

The PCI SSC tests and qualifies two types of auditors for Payment Card Industry (PCI) compliance: Approved Scanning Vendors (ASVs) and Qualified Security Assessors (QSAs).

These auditors enable merchants and payment data processors to comply with the standards set forth by the PCI SSC, known as the PCI Data Security Standard. This multifaceted security standard includes metrics on security management, policies, procedures and network architecture.

PCI and Your Organization

You are subject to PCI compliance if your organization touches or sees credit card information and cardholder data, either directly or as a service provider to another company. As an IT executive you are charged with PCI compliance, managing financial risks, preventing fraud from being conducted on your systems, and avoiding penalties as PCI evolves to become a government mandate both in the U.S. and worldwide.

Your company may be required to either conduct a self-assessment or have one performed by a PCI QSA, depending on your role in cardholder data handling and the number of transactions you conduct yearly. In all cases, PCI requires that an executive officer of your company sign-off on PCI compliance and assessment results. This highlights the accountability and liability inherent in the PCI process.

Approved Scanning Vendor (ASV) Services

The payment card industry (PCI) standard requires remote security testing of a merchant's Internet presence by an ASV. The ASV security scan passively probes hosts, via the Internet, that require remote auditing for PCI compliance.

This service combines security experts with best-of-breed scanning technology to identify real and potential vulnerabilities in Internet facing systems such as routers, firewalls, web servers and email servers.
